# Lesson Guide: Christology – The Study of Jesus Christ

### Summary

This second lesson in our Trinitarian theology series focused on Christology—the study of Jesus Christ. Dr. Mike Lawson explored both traditional doctrines and practical realities surrounding the person and work of Jesus, showing how Christ is the center of Scripture, theology, and human history. Drawing from Charles Ryrie's condensed theology outlines, Dr. Lawson walked the group through key concepts such as Jesus' deity, humanity, incarnation, death, resurrection, and future return.

Through personal stories, humor, and real-life testimonies from global missions, the lesson emphasized how belief in the resurrection of Christ changes lives and drives the global spread of the gospel. Dr. Lawson urged us not just to understand Christ theologically, but to treasure Him personally, knowing that our faith and future rest entirely on His life, death, and resurrection.

- Why is the resurrection so central to our faith, and how would you explain its importance to someone else?
- Have you ever experienced Jesus' Lordship personally—not just as Savior, but as one who leads your life daily?
- What real-life stories or examples (from the lesson or your own experience) demonstrate the impact of belief in the resurrection?

- How can you grow in your awe and worship of Jesus this Easter season?
